Dear Parents

I hope you are enjoying the warm weather and are trying to stay cool as you go about your daily tasks. Schools, as you may be aware, do not have the luxury of air conditioning but we are coping well inside by using fans and outside by finding the shade whenever possible. The children have been very good in remembering to wear their sun hats and drink lots of water. We have also had classrooms open for them to come into when it has just become too hot outside. Recent changes to our grounds have made us aware of a lack of shade outside. This to this end, we have purchased some gazebos that we will be able to use on Sports Day but they will also be used every summer to get us through periods of really hot weather.

The Role of SENCo

They say that you do not truly know what someone does until you step into their shoes and this has really been the experience for me taking on the role of SENCo. I always knew that Mrs Irving worked hard and was excellent in her role but now I have a greater understanding of what she did for the parents and children of our school. Thank you for your patience if you have been trying to see me this term. The role of SENCo involves many meetings, referrals to outside agencies and numerous phone calls. Although I have enjoyed this work immensely, on top of my own role it has made this term quite challenging. The role of the head teacher is multi-faceted and part of this is to cover things that are not being done for one reason or another. Nevertheless, I will be happy to hand this role over to Mrs Blakely in September when she becomes our new Inclusion Manager. Mrs Blakely will take on the role of SENCo but will also add to this responsibility the provision of more able children and continue her great work furthering mental health within our school. Mrs Blakely will be carrying out this role from Monday to Thursday and will be teaching in Maple Class (Year 3) on Friday, as Mrs Poole will be working for 4 days a week in September. I will be supporting Mrs Blakely initially in her new role.

Staffing Structure for September 2018

Attached you will see the staffing structure for next academic year. We are very fortunate in this time of difficult teacher recruitment to welcome three really good teachers to our school. Mrs Helen Parsons is joining the senior leadership of the school as Assistant Head and will be teaching Aspen Class (Year 5). She will be working with teaching assistants both in the classroom and in the playground to ensure that our provision and practice continues to improve. Miss Claire Minchinton will be joining us to teach Rowan Class (Year 3/4) and Miss Helen Moutray will be teaching the Year 1/2 children in Oak Class. With the coming of new staff, we also need to say goodbye to Mrs Carey who has been working with our Year 3 children. We would like to thank Mrs Carey for all she has done here at Woodley C of E and wish her well for the future.

Letters will be issued on 13th July informing you of your child's class teacher for next year.

Organising classes takes time and consideration. The current teachers look at age, ability, maturity and friendships before making decisions. Please talk to your child about their new classes ahead of their visits to the new classes on the morning of 19th July.

Curriculum News

Foundation Stage:

Foundation have had a lovely month learning all about under the sea creatures. We started by writing questions that we would like to find out, an example being 'How many teeth do sharks have?' We then set out finding the answers by looking through fact books, using the internet and watching videos. The children were very excited to create their very own fact book using some of the new facts that they had learnt!

We have also participated in Science Week which the children absolutely loved! We carried out some of our own experiments and investigations. The children were fascinated by the way the 'magic' beads changed colour in the light and lots of discussion followed.

The children have been working hard with their maths this month, in particular adding and taking away. We have looked closely at reading number sentences and working out whether we need to add or take away. The children have been using a variety of resources such as cubes, their fingers and number lines to solve the calculations. We have also been busy practising our number formation. This is something that we would encourage you to do at home with your child.

A definite favourite this month has been our visit from the police. Mr Plowright very kindly volunteered to come in and spend some time with our Foundation children and what a treat it was. He spoke to the children about what a policeman does and showed them some police equipment. The children then got a chance to ask some very thoughtful questions. The best bit was when we got to go out to the junior playground where a police car was waiting with its flashing lights and sirens along with various items of police kit. The children had such a great experience sitting in the police car, talking through the radio and testing out all of the equipment. We have been very impressed with how all of the children are now coming into school independently in the mornings. This will aid the transition into year 1 where they also come into school on their own. We cannot believe that we only have a short time left with our current foundation children. We have got lots of fun activities planned over the coming weeks including reading the story of the 'Rainbow Fish' and also learning all about pirates. We will be holding a pirate party at the end of the term where the children can come to school dressed as a pirate. More details to follow.

Key Stage 1:

In KS1 we have started off our new topic 'Glorious Gardens' with a school trip. Over the day, the children took part in various workshops where they learnt how to identify trees through the shapes of the leaves, learnt about seed dispersal by handling different seeds and went on a seed hunt. We found out about pollination by dressing up as flowers and bees and playing a game! The children had an opportunity to make their own paper plant pot and create a colourful leaf by 'nibbling' little parts off like caterpillars! We even had time to visit the playground after lunch, much to the children's delight. The leaders at the Nature Discovery Centre were amazing and everyone (including the adults) learnt a lot.

The children have written some fantastic thank you letters which we will send off. This half term, we are really looking forward to learning more about plants in science. We will be doing some still life drawings in art and, later on in the half term, we will learn about natural dyes in D&T. We have done a little work around Jack and the Beanstalk in our 'Golden Books' and the children have, once again, amazed us with their hard work. We are starting to look at other traditional tales from around the world which focus on growing.

In maths, we have been working

hard on the non-negotiables (these can be found in your child's home/school diary). We will be practising skills needed to tell the time and count money and would love children to focus on these at home too. Adding up coins and being able to read an analogue clock are skills which can be hard to acquire without plenty of real-life practise. Please continue to read regularly with your child. It is lovely to see so many parents are now signing the home/school diaries.

Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4)

It might be the final term in this academic year but the lower juniors are still as busy as ever! We kicked off this half term with our new topic: 'Sports around the World' by thinking about the sports that we enjoy doing in school and out of school. We are in full World Cup spirit and have enjoyed following the results.

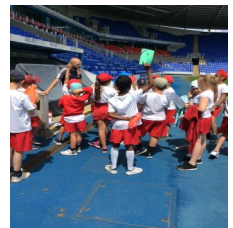
We were lucky enough to visit the Madejski stadium this term. Whilst we were there, we took part in four activities including; a stadium tour (involving a sneaky peak into the changing rooms!) a football lesson; a healthy eating workshop and a commentating activity. We loved learning about Reading Football Club and we are armed with lots of facts that we did not know before.

In English, we have been working on writing persuasive texts. We started by playing lots of language games to help us practice talking persuasively. We had to try to persuade a snowman to come in from the cold, which was fun! We hope that the children save their persuasive skills for the classroom and not try them out in the supermarket.

Shape, space and measure has been our focus this half term with a close look at different types of angles. We are now confident angle hunters and can tell the difference between acute, obtuse and right angles.

In science, we are currently enjoying developing our engineering skills and have progressed our vacuum cleaners to the build stage. In English, we have been using video media to inspire our descriptive writing. Our theme has been 'suspense' writing using a short film called Whitby Abbey. Rhetorical questions, short sentences and ellipsis have all been included, or have they.....?

In art this term, we have continued to make our fantastic models. Adding modroc to the armatures was fun but messy, it did give our models strength though. Some are now at the painting stage and the characters are taking shape – the children have really loved creating these.

In maths, Year 5 have been working hard on their non-negotiables and Year 6 have started a new project called 'Spiral maths', which is generating some intriguing patterns. A trip to Waingels was a highlight for a group of mathematicians, where problem solving and coding activities were tackled enthusiastically.

We have been fortunate this term to have an ex pupil, Jennifer Morton, come in to teach a few lucky pupils some Latin and again, our visitors from Waingels, were very popular as they taught Sycamore and Rowan German through fun activities.

We are now looking forward to an exciting Science Week and our trip to Reading University, as we have all been 'swabbed'. Year 6 have transition days to their secondary schools, very exciting, and some will be doing Bikeability. And of course, rehearsals are now taking place for our end of term production of 'The Key Master'. Children have learnt (are learning) their lines and song words.
