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### Curriculum News

#### Foundation Stage:

As we edge into the season of winter, we decided that our topic for this term will be 'It's Freezing!'. The children's role-play has involved exploring our recreation of the depths of the Antarctic, complete with a new igloo corner, before coming back to get warm by the fire and watch some TV in the home area. They have also conducted some ice investigations: learning how to make and melt ice before seeing what other everyday liquids they are able to freeze.

Over the past week we have been writing our own class stories about the Antarctic. We discussed the elements that make up a good story, including characters and settings, then created one of our own between us. I'm sure that you will soon be hearing all about the adventures of Snow Pickle the Snowflake from Chestnut and the Snow Bunny from Willow!

We are well underway with our Foundation Christmas Tableau rehearsals and you should have received a letter informing you of your child's role. The children have really enjoyed learning Christmas songs and look forward to showing you all how tuneful they are on Friday the 9<sup>th</sup> of December. Perhaps your child can teach you some of the actions to the songs?

#### Key Stage 1: (Years 1&2)

This half term, KS1's topic is: My Amazing Body! We have taken part in some fantastic investigations in science. When exploring our five senses, the children took part in an experiment with smell pots containing marmite, garlic and gingerbread syrup. They played a guess the sound game and marvelled at some optical illusions. The children were brave when we did a blindfolded taste test and were relieved when they discovered it was only a raisin! In RE, the children continued to explore with their senses when handling gold, frankincense and myrrh to explore the symbolism in gifts. In Design and Technology, the children continued to explore taste in sampling fruits for our healthy fruit salads.

We have been focusing on non-fiction books in our English lessons and the Y1 have really enjoyed making their own information books whilst the Y2 have begun to explore non-chronological reports on the body.

The children are also practising the Christmas play and we are amazed at how quickly they are learning their lines and instrument parts (Y2) and singing the songs (Y1 and Y2). We can't wait for you to see it!

#### Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4)

When we came back from the half term holidays, we started working on a new topic – The Ancient Egyptians. The children have been working hard and are enjoying learning about life 5000 years ago. So far we have talked about the importance of the Nile and the different roles people had in Egyptian Society. We have also been developing our musical skills. Year 4 have been learning to play the ukulele with Berkshire Maestros and Year 3 have been playing a range of percussion instruments with Mr Cutting. As it was Thanksgiving in America this week, we made mini-apple pies to mark the occasion. We made the pastry and chopped the apples.
