## Curriculum News

#### Foundation:

What another busy month we have had in foundation! The children have really enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year. We had discussions about how and why it is celebrated and made our own Chinese dragons and other art work. The children were fascinated by the Chinese New Year story and had lots of fun acting it out with their friends. We tried some Chinese food and the children were encouraged to say whether they liked or disliked it and why. When the weather took a turn for the worse we took full advantage of the learning opportunities that this presented. The children were excited by the tuff tray full of ice when they arrived at school one morning. We moved this interest forward by putting some animals and food colouring into the trays one afternoon before the children went home. They all predicted what they thought they were going to find the next morning. The children were amazed to find the animals trapped inside the ice! A big discussion was had about what had happened and how they were going to free the animals from the ice!

For the rest of the half term we will be focusing on the story of Jack and The Bean Stalk. We have started this week reading the story and acting it out for the children to gain a strong understanding of the story structure and key vocabulary. This week during adult led time the children have been given a challenge of making a Giant's castle using any resources they wish to use. They have had to design and make a list of the resources they need then make their castle. During this time we have seen the children demonstrate many of the characteristics of effective learning.

A highlight of last month was when a group of Japanese students came to visit our school. We have had these visits for the last 3 years and the children really gain a lot from them. All of the children in foundation had the opportunity to join in with Japanese songs and had a go at making some origami.

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### Curriculum News

#### Key Stage 1:

We have had a great start to our new topic 'Dinosaurs'. Last week, the children took part in a dinosaur workshop. First, the children met Chris who was our leader for the morning. He talked to the children about many different types of dinosaurs and explained how fossils are formed. The children got a chance to handle a fossilised dinosaur egg and dinosaur poo! Then he introduced us to a baby dinosaur called Jake. The children were invited up to stroke Jake and they learned some more facts about T-Rex dinosaurs. Last but not least, the children met Millie... a 10 foot tall T-Rex! We were so impressed with how brave everyone was - even Mrs Gurney had a photo with Millie! Chris explained that some T-Rex dinosaurs were the height of our PE hall which was surprising to all. Once Millie had gone, the three classes took part in a fossil workshop. There were all kinds of fossils: bones, horns, skulls, plants and fish. The children were really engaged and happy dusting off the fossils with brushes. Thank you to parents and carers for allowing the children to have this amazing



experience. The children have written about their day and we are really pleased with the work they have produced. We believe that Real and Practical experiences are fundamental to good quality learning.




In history, we have been learning about Mary Anning: a famous fossil collector, dealer and palaeontologist. The children were interested to learn facts about Mary Anning's eventful and inspiring life. It has been lovely to see children using the fossil areas in our role play corners to act out Mary Anning's story. In art, we are learning about printing and repeating patterns. We will be learning about Andy Warhol and other types of prints. In ICT, the children are planning out their own dinosaur videos in small groups. They are creating news reports, stories and fact files which they will record using an iPad.

In maths, the children have been working on fractions; from ordering them to converting between improper and mixed number fractions. The children have worked hard and have had to demonstrate their 'Brave' learning when embarking on more challenging concepts.

This week, we have been performing poetry. We looked carefully at poets such as Michael Rosen to try and identify the skills we need to bring poems to life. The children look forward to sharing their poems with you at the end of term.




## Curriculum News

Upper Key Stage 2: (Years 5&6)

A short but eventful month for the Upper Juniors, especially year 6s, with mock SATS starting the term. It was a good practice and everyone tried their best.

Our topic 'Extreme Earth' continues to inspire us and we are experts at explaining how earthquakes happen, why volcanoes erupt and how tornadoes develop. We are now looking at mountains and have investigated the different ways in which they are formed.



In science we have looked at the effect exercise has on our hearts, in particular, the increase in beats per minute. Some pulses were difficult to find! We especially enjoyed investigating different recovery activities – laying down was popular.

In art we have studied and sketched animals that live in harsh, extreme conditions. We will now be making a clay model of these animals and creating a diorama of their habitat (using a shoe box).

Whilst the Year 6s are focusing on their SATS; developing skills and strategies to help them, year 5s have been looking at journalistic writing, using the devastating earthquake in Nepal as a stimulus. In maths, they have immersed themselves in fractions and are now more confident in equivalent fractions and a converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa.

Again, the Japanese students were welcomed visitors and we made some intricate origami birds and samurai helmets....with their guidance. Mrs Alison Shaman, UKS2 Phase Leader.
