## Key Stage 1 (Years 1&2):

## Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4)

This month has certainly been a busy one for the Lower Juniors! We have been exploring our space topic and have found out some interesting information. Did you know that every year the moon moves 3.8cm away from Earth?

In English, we have been looking at poetry. We have spent time learning about different poetic devices such as rhyme and alliteration. From this we wrote our own alien poems which we are really proud of. We have been hunting for right angles in maths whilst learning about obtuse and acute angles. Ask your child if they can explain the difference between them.

Science has been electrifying this half term. We are now experts in building circuits and have created our own game which lights up when they right answer is selected.

We have ended the term with a big bang! The Lower Junior production; 'Up, Up and Away!' was a giant success. We celebrated the work we have done this term through a variety of mediums. We hope you enjoyed our singing and dancing whilst learning new information about space. The Lower Junior Team are really proud of how hard the children have worked this term. ## Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5&6)

A month filled with celebration. World Book Day gave us the opportunity to dress up as our favourite book characters – Where's Wally and Harry Potter were again popular, but there was also an Oompa Loompa and a fantastic Mr Fox!
