


Topic Overview

Christmas and Christingle are celebrated by Christians at the Church.



Tradition:

Beliefs or practices which are carried out over a number of years.

Festival:

A time of celebration for a religion, culture or society.

Henna:

Used to decorate hands for Diwali and Eid.

Christingle:

A candle held during Advent to show Christ is the light of the world.

Place of worship:

A special building religious people go to pray and celebrate.
