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Foundation Stage:

Another busy month has been had by all in foundation!

We have been focussing our work around the story Jack and The Beanstalk. To start off our topic we read the story where the children thoroughly enjoyed joining in rather enthusiastically with the 'fee fi fo fum...' bits. We acted out the story and drew story maps so that we became familiar with the story structure. This enabled the children to really know the story for when they had a go at writing it. A highlight for the children has been planting their own beans and watching them grow. We will be measuring them next week to see who's bean has grown the tallest.

In phonics we have been working really hard to consolidate the phase 3 sounds before some children move on after Easter. We have been practising our sentence writing by rehearsing the sentence that we want to write, using a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop. We have also

been encouraging the children to read back what they have written to ensure that it makes sense. We are very impressed with how hard the children have been working at this!

In Maths we have been practising to add and subtract. The children have been taught to use a range of strategies such as their fingers, using objects and a number line. They have really enjoyed completing our independent maths challenges that we have out in the environment. The last couple of weeks we have been learning all about doubling and halving. The children have really enjoyed doubling the spots on a ladybird and halving the pirate's treasure.



We are very much looking forward to our trip to Rushall Farm just after the Easter holidays. We have been going for a number of years and the children always have such a fantastic time. The trip will start off our topic on farms.

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Key Stage 1:

The second half of the Spring Term has been a Royal affair! Our 'Knights and Castles' topic has

been fully embraced by the children who have all enjoyed learning about our Queen and King Henry VIII.

We were lucky enough to receive a video message from 'The Queen' who encouraged us to write her a letter to gather more information about her. We thought about questions we would like to ask as well as the appropriate way to address her. The children worked hard on learning the skills needed to write a letter and each produced an excellent letter to be proud of. We will be sending the letters soon; fingers crossed for a reply!

In Maths, we have been very busy. From measures to division we have been challenging the children to use and apply their understanding of number to a variety of curriculum areas. The children have been particularly interested in measure where they have been measuring length in centimetres. Try and



encourage your child to apply their knowledge of measure at home; this helps consolidate the skills they have learnt at school.

We have been studying the artist Paul Klee and have tried out a range of his famous techniques. The children have been drawing and painting their own castle pictures. We are impressed with the outcome and look forward to sharing them with you soon.

Yet again we are astounded by the high quality home learning that we have received this term.

The children have excelled themselves creatively and have brought in projects that are impressive for such young people! We have thoroughly enjoyed the sweet treats for The Queen and think we may have some potential star bakers within KS1.

We enjoyed our trip to Hampton Court Palace on Thursday 4th April. It was a lovely way to end an exciting and busy term.

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Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4)

The second half of the Spring Term has been both exciting and extremely busy in the Lower Juniors. As you are probably more than aware by now, our topic has been mostly about SPACE and linking that to our work on The Iron Man.

In English, although we have finished reading The Iron Man by Ted Hughes, we have continued to incorporate it into our learning. We learned how to write a persuasive letter and all the features needed. The phase successfully persuaded Mrs Gurney to allow them to watch the film The Iron Giant by promising to work on it and use it to compare and contrast with the book. In addition we also showed what we *really* know about space by producing a non-chronological report.

In Maths, our focus has been on fractions. It has been lovely to see the children having their 'lightbulb moments' and realising that they have gone from not understanding, to knowing a topic well enough that they can explain it to others.

We have been completely WOWed by the topic of Space and the children's dedication to producing amazing pieces of work. The facts that they have found out at school have been well used in the work that they have produced at home. The homework has stunned and impressed many members of staff not only because of the effort put in but for decorating the classrooms and corridors so beautifully. We were

pleased that you got to see the vast array of marvels at the LKS2 performance work showcase.

We experienced a space day where we received a letter from the local Police stating that some suspicious 'alien' eggs were spotted on our field. The children wrote an account of what had happened and a narrative on their predictions on what was in the egg. On this day we also tried some space food – dehydrated fruit, watched science experiments happening in space and had a tour of the international space station. We all had a fantastic time at the Woodley Aviation Museum where the children showed how much they had learned and how curious they were





to learn more – they were a real credit to Woodley CofE Primary. We have written letters to the volunteers who run the museum thanking them for their time and knowledge.

Design and Technology was something to behold across the phase. Thank you for providing the boxes, bottles and bottle-tops to allow the children to have a great day designing, building and evaluating their Iron People. The day was enjoyed by all with the children discussing design features, learning to work with different children, compromising and making intricate decisions on what the best features of their Iron Person would be.

In Science, we have been learning about electricity and circuits – asking questions, making predictions and testing hypotheses.

A massive thank you needs to be said from the whole LKS2 team for your involvement in our performance, from: encouraging your children to learn their lines; for bringing them back for the evening performances; for laughing at the bad jokes and generally supporting your children in their learning. As a final point, please continue to read 5-times-a-week (and signing the diary), it really does help in their reading stamina, fluency and pleasure. Times Table Rockstars is proving to be a winner in the classrooms as it taps into the competitive nature of children, both with themselves and their peers – please continue to encourage them to log on and rock-on! 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Upper Key Stage 2: (Years 5&6)

The term started with a practical theme, as the children brought in their amazing home learning: ships, plates and Trojan horses. It continued to be creative as in DT, we enjoyed tasting some traditional Greek starters and even had a go at making our own tzatziki – it actually tasted very authentic.

In Art we have been studying Greek sculpture and made our own mini sculptures using... a bar of soap. In computing, we used Scratch to create a game based on a myth. It involved the Minotaur, who continuously stalks Theseus, as he tries to collect the ancient coins. We certainly have some impressive coders in our school.

Keeping with the mythological theme, we have been writing our own myths, which have included the essential: hero, beast and problem to solve. Our writing has definitely improved and we are now including more complex sentences and high order punctuation such as: parenthesis, colons and semi colons. Our newspaper reports were based around the events of the Trojan horse and we now know what 'Beware of Greeks bearing gifts.' means!

Science has been all about mechanisms: pulleys, levers and gears, we made our own pulleys and designed our own marvelous mechanisms.

We enjoyed a trip to the URE museum, part of Reading University, and were lucky enough to handle some Greek pottery and look at the detail of the designs. RE this term has been looking at the Easter story and, as usual, RE Inspired led an interesting discussion on the events of Holy week. Now we are all looking forward to our Easter holidays.
