Dear Parents,

Important —Face Coverings and Social Distancing on our site

Thank you for your co-operation and support with our staggered drop-off and collection times. We have noticed that, on occasion, it is really difficult for parents and carers to keep to social distancing guidance. Social distancing guidance is 2metres or 1metre with mitigation. We, therefore, **strongly advise you to wear face coverings** when dropping off and collecting your children from school. Our aim is to ensure that our school stays open for as long as possible as the most important thing is the education of our children. Anything we ask you to do will have this aim in mind. We know that the wearing of face-coverings is recommended when social distancing is difficult.

As a school, we have staff outside directing parents and they are trying to maintain social distancing guidance. However, guidance states that it is the responsibility of every adult to try to ensure social distancing measures happen.

We believe Face-Coverings will make our site safer. Other local primary schools are now expecting this of parents and we will be starting this from **Monday 14th September**. Staff on duty outside will be wearing their visors. We chose to wear visors in school to ensure children can see our faces.

*Please be mindful that some people may not be able to wear face coverings due to a medical condition.

Reading

You should now have received our letter about reading. In KS2, we are very excited as the children are starting to get their books from the Accelerated Reading (AR) Scheme, and again we give our thanks to the PTA for funding this.

The AR scheme is based on the children having a ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development). This is a range that your child is asked to choose books from and is based on an assessment that they have taken in school. Children need to read books for comprehension but also for pleasure. Books towards the lower ZPD range will probably not extend your child's decoding ability. If you feel that the book your child has chosen is too easy, it is probably because they have chosen a book at the lower end of the range. If this is the case, they need to read the book quickly and complete the quiz in school (every book read has a quiz). They will then be able to choose a book which is more challenging.

If you require any further information about AR, please do not hesitate to email your child's class teacher.

<u>Tik-Tok</u>

It has been brought to our attention by the Wokingham E-Safety Team and Thames Valley Police that there has been some disturbing content circulating on the App/Site called Tik-Tok. We would like to remind parents that Tik-Tok's age restriction is 12+.

We have uploaded a Tik-Tok guide along with this letter. Please take the time to read this if it is relevant to you and your child.
