### Foundation Stage:

We've had yet another busy half term in Foundation. We have focused our work around Under the Sea where the children have been learning to retrieve information from texts. We have then been using the information that we have retrieved to create our own fact files. We have worked really hard on modelling to the children how to construct sentences properly. This has involved rehearsing our sentence aloud a number of times so that it sticks in our heads. We then use our phonic knowledge to sound out each word and make sure that we are using finger spaces correctly. Finally, we make sure that our sentence has a full stop at the end. We repeat this process with each sentence that we write and encourage the children to re-read what they have written to check for any mistakes. We were super impressed with the final outcome of the fact files. Well done Foundation!



Over the last couple of weeks, we have been learning all about pirates. We have learnt about famous pirates, made pirate maps and flags, pirate wanted posters and pirate pizza boats amongst other fun activities! In Maths we have been consolidating all of the areas that we have worked on this year including reliable counting techniques, addition and subtraction, ordering numbers and solving mathematical problems.

Please remember to keep up the reading over the summer holidays as this will be very beneficial to your child. Please visit the library to choose some suitable books to read as we will be collecting in the reading books over the holidays.

What a fantastic year we have had teaching and getting to know your children. We can't quite believe how quickly the time has gone! We are all so proud of the progress that the children have made this year and would like to wish them good luck as they move up into Year 1. We know that they will all continue to work hard and show a really brave attitude towards their learning. 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#### Key Stage 1:

Time really flies when you are having fun! At the end of last half term, we celebrated our hard work by having a seaside day. The children were thrilled to paddle and play with sand and of course, they enjoyed eating ice-pops! We hope you enjoyed looking through our photos which are on the school website.

This half term, our topic has been 'Around the World'. We have explored landmarks around the world; comparing man-made to physical landmarks. The children have developed their skills as geographers and have been investigating Australia. We have discussed famous Australian landmarks and compared life in Australia to life in the United Kingdom. The home learning we have seen has ,yet again, impressed us this half term. KS1 have excelled themselves creatively and have produced work to be proud of.

In English, we have been investigating 'Dreamtime' stories and have looked carefully at 'Tiddalik'. The children have created their own characters and have re-written the stories which have included adjectives, similes and adverbs.





We have been learning about the inverse especially in multiplication and division. We have been revising multiples and looking at patterns of number to help us learn our times tables. The children were brilliant at spotting patterns and enjoyed thinking of ways to help them remember multiplication and division facts.

In Science, we have been investigating different types of animals. The children have been keen to extend their scientific vocabulary and compare differences and similarities between animal types.

Music has been a real highlight in KS1 this half term. We have learnt some songs which originate from Australia, including an Australian Iullaby. The children have explored rhythm, pitch and body percussion. They have even composed their own rhythms using notations of their choice and have

performed as a group. If you haven't already, ask your child to sing you one of the songs we have been practising; you are in for a treat!

Sports Day was a real success! All of our children took part with a smile on their face. It was wonderful to see how hard the

children tried and the encouragement and support they gave each other when competing.

Writing this final newsletter fills me with sadness. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff, children and families for making the last 9 years at Woodley so special. I came here 10 years ago as a student teacher and I am leaving as a Phase Leader with 9 wonderful years of teaching under my belt. I have been lucky enough to do a job that I love whilst working with both amazing colleagues and children. I will always have a piece of Woodley in my heart and I hope to share the 'Woodley Way' with the staff and children at my new school. I wish the best of luck to all of you in the future. 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#### Lower Key Stage 2:

Wow! How time flies. This is the final newsletter before we break up for the summer holidays.

Once again, we have been astounded by the effort and dedication into the topic home learning. We had a lovely mixture of totem poles, Native American scenes, dream catchers and marble runs. Showing the best of the children's skills.

In English, we have been imagining we are Pilgrims enduring the long, arduous journey across the Atlantic Ocean to America, on the Mayflower. The children have acted out their parts, listened to accounts from the journey and finally, written their own diary entry.

In Maths, we have had the excitement of co-ordinates, 2D and 3D shapes along with using our measuring skills to make play dough which leads us onto mass and capacity. Lots of practical learning opportunities and the use of different apparatus.

We experienced Native American day where we got to sit in a real-life tipi, play Native American instruments and listen to stories from different tribes. The children were able to choose an animal to represent, play their instruments, dance and experience a Pow-wow where we all participated **together as shown** in the picture below.





Also as part of our experience we made talking sticks – we are hoping these can be used well at home.

The aim is that the person who is holding the stick is the only person who should be speaking. We hope that the children have communicated that to you. We have completed circuits with copper tape and an LED bulb which the children incorporated into a picture of a Native American nature.

We all had a fantastic time at the Woodley Sports day which showed the children's inclusive nature and let them have a little healthy competition. It was

lovely to see good sportsmanship with cheering each other along and congratulating. It was also a pleasure to see the children having picnic lunches with their families.

Design and Technology, again, has been exciting. The children are really extending their sewing skills with making headdresses at the end of Summer term 1 and moving onto making their own mini tipis which includes cutting out patterns and attaching sticks.

In Science, we have been looking at magnets and attraction and repulsion. The children used these skills, junk modelling and their imagination to produce some spectacular games which showed many elements of the science curriculum. We know that some of the games have been extended at home which is a pleasure to hear.

As a final point, please continue to read over the summer holidays. Local libraries are a great source of up-to-date, varied books and always run a summer competition. Times Table Rockstars participation has dipped slightly but the holidays are a perfect time to get rocking once more and keep those skills up to scratch, ready for next year. This will be great for the year 3s

going into year 4 where they will be the first year to do the Multiplication Tables Check in the final term.

It has been a pleasure to work with the children over this year, it has gone by so quickly. We wish you all a great summer and look forward to welcoming you back in September.
