## Dear Parents

First of all, can I thank the vast majority of you who have supported the school and made the new arrangements since we have returned to school successful. I know the staggered start and finished times have inconvenienced many parents and they have had to make new work arrangements accordingly.

## The Behaviour of Woodley C of E children in the community

We pride ourselves on the excellent behaviour of our children in school and in the community. Unfortunately, I have received complaints about our children, mainly Year 6, swearing and fighting in out local park. This seems to be because many Year 6 children now have permission to walk to and from school on their own. Please can I remind parents that we can withdraw this privilege from Year 6 and the expectation is that they walk to and from school directly, not stopping off in the park or in the local shops. I have spoken to all of our Year 6 children about the reputation of the school and how we expect them to behave when they are wearing their school uniform.

## Staffing the school

One of the things that is needed when trying to run a school is the flexibility to move staff. Bubbles, whether class or phase, has made this much more difficult. We have stringent plans in place at Woodley C of E to manage all the issues that social distancing brings, as well as recovery plans for the education of the children. You will find the Senior Leadership Team of the school involved in all aspects of COVID management and Mr Blakely and I are also looking forward to being lunch time controllers next week! To this end, we just need more staff at all points in the day. Where teachers could manage a rolling start from 8.40 am, our official start time has always been 8.50 am. Pupils could not be deemed as being late before this time. My TAs and office staff do not start work until 8.45 am, 5 minutes before the official start of school. The school budget will not allow me to change working patterns so 8.50 am has to be our first arrival time. If this is causing you insurmountable problems, please do not hesitate to contact me. Maybe a friend can bring your child in or look after them for a few minutes.

#### **Recovery Plan**

After being out of school for 5 months, the children have come back in a range of different places, both educationally and emotionally. Some children have thrived during lockdown whilst others have found it incredibly difficult. The first 4 weeks have given the children time to settle and get back into school routines. We have already seen learning improve over the last 4 weeks. Assessments have now taken place which have allowed us to plan future work to fill the gaps. New learning must be built on firm foundations as otherwise it will not become part of our children's long term memory. From Monday 5th October, grouping will start in phase bubbles and this will ensure that learning is more targeted. More details about "recovery" will follow in the following weeks.

#### The School Day

We may now have the capacity to lengthen the school day, at the end of the day by 10 minutes. This would mean that the first pick up time would be 3:10pm, then 3:20pm and finally 3:30pm. In the next few weeks you will be receiving a survey asking you whether you would like pickup times to stay the same or to be extended by 10 minutes. Mr Blakely and I will take this into account before making any changes.
