<b>I enjoy doing hands-on activities</b>	Collect together a selection of items from around your house and garden. Take it in turns to smell the items whilst wearing a blindfold – can you guess what you are smelling?	Set up an obstacle course around your home or garden using boxes, chairs, cushions etc. Time how long it takes you to complete it. Can you beat your family members?	Make some Easter nests using melted chocolate, shredded wheat/rice crispies and mini eggs – yum! Can you write down the instructions for someone else to make them?
<b>I enjoy listening and making music</b>	Watch a new musical film, or one that you already love, as a family.	Listen to a piece of classical music and use crayons or pencils to draw what it makes you think of or how it makes you feel.	Use 'junk modelling' materials from your recycling to make an instrument. E.g. make a guitar with a box and elastic bands, or a shaker filled with beads.

Collect some natural resources such as leaves, flowers, twigs etc and create a collage. You could get these from your garden or on a walk around your local environment.	Draw or paint an Easter picture – you could draw some Easter eggs, some flowers, chicks or even the Easter Bunny!
