As we approach the end of another school year I would like to thank all staff, governors, parents and especially the pupils for all their hard work and focus in support of their individual and school wide goals. During several visits around the school this year many governors have had the opportunity to observe a typical day at the school. We were certainly impressed by the professionalism of the staff and the enthusiasm of all the pupils to embrace the BRIGHT Learning strategy across the whole school. Personally, I was delighted to see that the wonderful ethos that underpins everything we do at this school was still very evident throughout. This was a something we were very keen to preserve and was a key objective during the Head Teacher recruitment last year. So THANK YOU to everyone here for their part in maintaining that caring and loving ethos at Woodley C of E school.

The leadership of all schools is becoming increasingly difficult in the current climate and our leadership team have had plenty of expected and some unexpected challenges throughout another busy school year. We remain fully committed to further develop the school and to deliver an improving and outstanding education here. We should consider that everyone plays their part in taking this school forward and it is not something that the staff can do alone. With that in mind I wanted to highlight a disappointing statistic that hit my radar in recent months.

The overall rate of persistent pupil absence in our school is 3.6%. It is important to remind everyone that attendance during term time is important and any absence must be approved by the Head Teacher in line with the school attendance policy. The governing body have asked the Head Teacher to refer any unauthorised absence to the local authority for their review and possible intervention. We would very much appreciate your support as we strive to make the required and very necessary improvement in this particular area.

On this evening, you will be given our new Parent Pack, Curriculum Bulletin and our Home/School Agreement. This is a very important meeting, so please put the date in your diary now, Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September from 6.30 pm. Specific times for each phase to follow.

## Foundation Stage:

Foundation have had lots of fun over the past couple of weeks learning about the story of Jack and The Beanstalk. We have acted the story out where the children thoroughly enjoyed taking on the role of the characters. A highlight has been planting our own magic beans! We learnt about planting and what the beans will need to grow. It has been amazing watching some of the beans grow into beanstalks...we hope that there isn't a giant at the top though!



The children have also made their own Jack and The Beanstalk hand puppets where they learnt how to sew. It was lovely to see how proud they were of themselves.



Over the next few weeks, taking us up to the end of term, we will be learning about pirates and seas.

We have started preparing the children for our transition up to KS1. We can't believe that it is nearly the end of the school year! This week we will be welcoming our new children on their first transition visits to school and the following week will see the whole school transition day.

## Key Stage 1 (Years 1&2):

In KS1, we have started our new topic 'Around the World'. The topic has a geography focus and the children are comparing life in Australia to life in England. We have spent time looking in atlases to find out about capital cities and continents. We have watched videos about Australian people, animals and landmarks. In English, we are studying stories from other cultures. The children have listened to many Dreamtime stories which are traditional tales in Australia. We have learned the story of Tiddalick and the children have had great fun filming each other telling the story.



In art, we are looking at Aboriginal paintings and pointillism. The children have created some wonderful pictures already and are working on their final piece. In science, we are working on classifying animals and discussing their features.

This half term, Show and Tell will be on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> of July. The children can bring in something special to them or something linked to our topic. We will begin our work on transition from Y1 to Y2 and Y2 to Y3 soon to help prepare your children for change. Where did the time go?!

## Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4)

Another busy month in the Lower Juniors and lots of strange things have happened. An alien landed in the playground who sent us a video asking us to explain where he had landed.

We decided, in order to complete this mission, we would need to learn everything there is to know about explanation texts. The children are now familiar with the key features of explanation texts and are gearing up to responding to the alien [who seems very friendly!]

In maths we have recapped fractions and decimals. The children are much more confident in finding the fractions of numbers. We are now applying our understanding of decimals and fractions to measure.

In ICT we are designing our own amusement park. The children have researched existing parks and have thought carefully about creating a park which will be popular and fun. We are making PowerPoint presentations to present our business ideas to our friends and teachers.


In RE, we have been floating along The River Ganges. We have had thoughtful discussions considering why the river is sacred to Hindu's.

I have learnt that it is the idea that counts and there are many creative ways to put this across."* The children were certainly inspired – here is a quote from a child's thankyou letter, *"My classmates and I were so privileged to have you on the big screen in our classroom talking to us. You are such a nice, kind and genuine woman and I hope you and our school stay in touch. When you connected the call, I felt I wanted to jump up and down with excitement. You had such a good understanding and gave open answers to all our questions."* Gill Lewis's comment on the event was 'I had a fab time' We will be sending her a book made up of the children's poems, artwork and creative writing from 'Sky Hawk' in the future.
