### Year 6 SATS

This month has been very busy in school. I would like to say “well done” to all our Year 6 children. I am sure they will tell you that I always say to them that no one can do any more than their best and I am pleased to report that everyone did this. I was very proud of the calm, serious and hard-working way that our children approached their SATS. Thank you to the Year 6 parents for the support you have given your children leading up to SATS. I would also like to thank the Year 6 staff, the other teaching assistants who were involved in access arrangements and Mrs. Smith, who helped me to administer the process.

### Taking Children Out of School During Lesson Time and Holidays

I am well aware that there are times when children need to come in late or be taken out of school but this is supposed to be under “exceptional” circumstances. Things such as emergency doctors or dentists, funerals, family emergencies are of course understandable but children seem to be missing school for things that really are not “exceptional”. Thank you to the parents who have volunteered to help our year 6 team. The staff are working hard to make their final assessments of your children’s progress culminating in your child’s end of year report.

This is really important for our year 6 children who will be moving on to secondary school but they still have much to do with us including their end of year production and leavers' assembly.

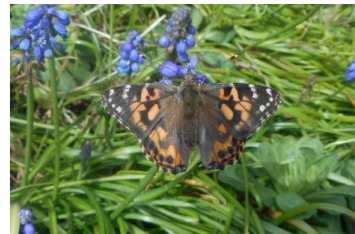
When we returned to school after Easter, the children were delighted to find that their beloved caterpillars had changed into butterflies! We fed them with sugar water on flowers and, when the temperature was right, we named them and let them go. It was a beautiful moment and the excitement amongst the children was amazing.

Our topic, this half term, has been 'Wacky Weather' and what a wacky time we have had! In English, we made wonderful poems about the seasons. In art, we studied trees by Mondrian, Van Gogh, Klimt and Gestel. In science, we have made all kinds of experiments from making a tornado in a glass jar to water that 'walks' from one cup to another. Phew!

Of course the Year 2 children have also been very busy with their 'special papers' for 'Victorian day'. We are very proud of how hard they worked and think they have thoroughly earned their half term break. The Year 1 children have also been brilliant working hard learning about alien words and practising their phonic skills.

When we come back, our school trip is in the first week back (Oak/Fir - Weds, Ash - Thurs). Children will need:

A drink with a cap/lid which can be opened and closed (no drinks are provided). A packed lunch (if you haven't ordered), trainers, sun lotion applied before school, school uniform (legs covered as we will be going through long grass and there will be bugs), light rain coat and a hat. Please return your forms/money ASAP if you haven't already.



# Curriculum News

Lower Key Stage 2: (Years 3&4) Another busy half term for the Lower Juniors, in all areas of the curriculum. We invaded the summer term with our new topic 'The Romans' which all of our children were eager to investigate. Part of our topic included a trip to The Reading Museum where not only were we able to dress up, but we were able to handle artefacts that were more than 1,000 years old. Our guide answered many of our burning questions and told us lots of information which informed us how clever the Romans were. In English we used the story 'Escape from Pompeii' to travel back to the Roman times and witness the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. The children watched videos of exploding volcanos to help them imagine what it would have been like to watch the eruption live.



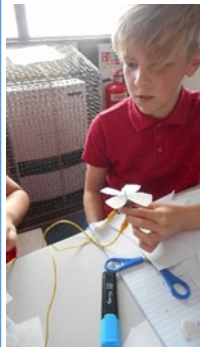
Through drama, the children interviewed each other to practise using emotive language when writing from the perspective of an eyewitness of the eruption. The children used these experiences to write quality newspaper reports. The children have enjoyed relating their maths skills to the Royal Wedding. They used their knowledge and understanding of money to plan a party and were given a budget, which they *had* to stick to. They also tested their skills in converting between measures to help work out the perimeter and

area of items such as tablecloths. Next time you have a party, why not ask your child to help you plan. In art, the children have enjoyed learning about mosaics. They have designed and made their own mosaics in the style of The Romans. Solids, liquids and gases have been the focus of our learning in science this half term. We have investigated the properties of different states of matter and looked closely at unusual substances such as jelly and shaving foam, which challenged our classification skills. In PSHE, the children took part in 'Mental Health Awareness' week where we explored the different ways to promote mental wellbeing. The children discussed these strategies in a mature, empathetic way, and we are proud of their attitudes towards such important topics.

## Upper Key Stage 2: (Years 5&6)



Although Year 6 have been working hard towards their SATS, we have still enjoyed learning new topics - starting with science. Making our own vacuum cleaner is proving to be challenging, however we are now experts at electrical circuits and are following an engineering process. So you never know, a new 'Dyson' may emerge.

King Arthur was the focus of the Year 5s in literacy and they were proud of their own legends centred on Camelot. They also worked hard on a project about castles during SATS week.

In topic, we now have a deeper understanding of why the Anglo Saxons and Vikings invaded England and how our country changed as a result.

In art this term, we are making a sculpture of an historical figure of our choice. We have now completed an armature using pliers to bend the wire and have created form with newspaper – they already look great without any mod-roc or paint so we can't wait to finish our models soon.

And finally, we are learning about Buddhism in RE: their beliefs, special places and Holy books. Following on from the Mental Health week, we are incorporating more mindfulness into our day. Practising mindfulness can help to calm our thoughts and let our stress and worries go.

# Reminders from the Office

## **Safeguarding**

Please may we remind parents that inline with our safeguarding policy parents are not permitted into the building before school starts. This is valuable time for teachers to prepare for the start of the day and not an ideal time to catch up with parents. Alternatively please leave a message with the member of staff on the door in the morning or leave a message at the office.

## **New Half Term**

It is important that children have a water bottle in school every day. As the weather remains warm it is important the children stay hydrated throughout the day. On very sunny days a hat is advisable and if possible applying sun cream before school will also help protect your child.

## **School Dinners**

We have an increasing number of children who are arriving at school without a hot dinner pre-ordered. If you do not yet have access to the online booking system please let the office know and we can arrange for an activation code to be sent home.

## **Waste Collection**

Following a successful pilot in other schools in the borough, our waste collection contractor are rolling out food waste recycling to nominated schools. We have been selected and this scheme will start immediately after the half term break. All food waste will be taken to a local anaerobic digestive facility in Basingstoke where it is processed and converted into renewable energy. We will be talking to the children about this scheme on the first day back after half term.

Please note that all waste from packed lunches will be kept in children's lunch boxes to be taken home. This will mean that you can see exactly what your children are eating in school. Only food waste will be collected and disposed of in school. This is a good time to remind everyone that we are a nut free school so all nut snacks and sandwich fillings are not permitted. Thank you for supporting us with this initiative to keep our children with allergies safe.
